

# Commuter Trip Reduction Program for Headquarters

Many WSDOT employees use commuter trip reduction (CTR) options, such as walking, biking, riding the bus or train, or sharing rides to work in carpools and vanpools. Some employees are eligible for telework and compressed work weeks to reduce their commute trips.

## Your commute options

### Cash incentives

If you carpool, walk, roll, or bicycle to work and track those trips at [RideshareOnline.com](https://rideshareonline.com), you're eligible for incentive payments added to your paycheck on a quarterly basis. This is a taxable incentive.

### CTR ORCA card

If your assigned duty station is at Headquarters, but your home address is in King, Pierce, Snohomish, or Kitsap County, you may qualify for a fare-free transit card through the CTR ORCA incentive.

### Vanpool subsidy

The Legislature provides funding for state employees to cover 100 percent of the cost of a qualifying vanpool fare when participating in a public transit agency vanpool program. Sign up for this new benefit by emailing [TripReduction@wsdot.wa.gov](mailto:TripReduction@wsdot.wa.gov). You will be provided with a participant agreement form if you choose to participate in a vanpool.
